

Mr. J. Hedigan

Mr. John Hedigan, of Geraldstown, Dublin who has died, was the owner of the Brian Boru bar, at Cross Guns Bridge, Dublin—one of the many pubs mentioned in James Joyce's "Ulysses."

Born in Galbally, Co. Limerick, Mr. Hedigan took over the pub when his uncle died in 1939.

He was chairman of the Licensed Vintners' Association in the 50s and was a member of the Dublin Chamber of Commerce.

Mr. Hedigan is survived by his wife and 12 children.

Mr. Hedigan was a defeated Fine Gael candidate in Dublin, in the 1954 General Election, and was a close friend of the late General Richard Mulcahy.

The Taoiseach, Mr. Cosgrave, was represented at his funeral.
